

The need for collaboration is more important than ever, and the BID strengthened many key partnerships in 2021, spanning everything from homelessness and mental health to economic development and mobility. We look forward to continuing to work with our many community partners in 2022 on these important city-wide issues.

We're proud of all that the BID accomplished in 2021, from assisting in the creation of the Unhoused Action Coalition to the return of our holiday party at the iconic Fillmore Auditorium. I won't spoil everything that our team accomplished - that's what the rest of the report is for.

As COVID cases continue to decline, signs of normalcy are returning along the corridor. People lining up for shows at our music venues, friends meeting up for dinner or drinks, strangers striking up conversation on the street. We think the 1UP Arcade Bar summed it up best on their sign (check out the photo on the next page) that Colfax Ave is "Less Fancy, More Fun" - we're looking forward to lots of unfancy fun in 2022.

As we look towards the future, there are a number of exciting projects coming to Colfax. These developments will bring over 580 apartment units to our district, in a time when we desperately need more housing to make Denver more affordable for all. Many of the projects also include retail space for more businesses to thrive. Business and residential growth will also benefit from the Colfax Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) project. ABOUT COLFAX AVE

The Colfax Ave Business Improvement District (BID) works to build a dynamic and inclusive community along the Colfax corridor. Through increased marketing and visibility, cleaner and safer streets, streetscape improvements, and partnerships with various City agencies and community groups, the BID maintains Colfax's unique character while attending to the evolving needs of the commercial district.





One of the main responsibilities of a Business Improvement District is to keep the area clean and welcoming for all. Led by our Operations Manager, Mitch Freund, our clean team is out on the street every day - emptying our public trash receptacles, keeping the rightof-way clean, removing graffiti, assisting with special projects, and maintaining things like our street benches, pedestrian light poles, bike racks, and art-wrapped power boxes.

TRASH RECEPTACLES

In 2021, we installed 10 new and 4 refurbished trash receptacles, bringing our total to 64 public receptacles. We're on our way to having a receptacle on every corner of our stretch of Colfax.

We also installed branded Colfax Ave decals on all of our trash receptacles. Small steps like this show the community who is taking responsibility for these trash receptacles, while also creating a sense of place, and adding some color to a typically drab piece of street furniture.



COMING IN 2022

In 2022, we'll continue to take care of our existing assets including giving many of our pedestrian light poles a muchneeded fresh coat of paint and converting remaining light fixtures to LED.

Street trees are a very important component of what makes an urban environment feel welcoming and enjoyable. While trees planted in the right-of-way are the responsibility of adjacent property owners, we are making an investment in 2022 to provide an equitable and sustainable tree pruning program. The program will ease the burden on property owners and help care for existing trees, making sure the trees continue to provide valuable shade and prosperity in the area for many more years.

COLFAX WORKS

In 2021, we launched a hybrid model of our successful Colfax Works program. The program provides employment and supportive services for those experiencing or emerging from homelessness or incarceration. Crews provide enhanced clean team services to area businesses and are responsible for trash, surface litter, graffiti, and sticker removal within the district.

Our successful Bag of Colfax program returned in 2021 to help remind people to shop local for the holidays. 




































The work we do on Colfax is made possible by the many community partners who are working tirelessly to improve our city. Here are just a few of the collaborative efforts we are proud to be a part of.

UNHOUSED ACTION COALITION

In 2021, we helped create what is now a growing coalition of diverse community groups collectively known as the Unhoused Action Coalition, or UAC. Decades of policy decisions have eliminated support for people suffering from poverty, mental health illnesses, and addiction. These challenges cannot be solved overnight, but efforts to address them must be accelerated to provide immediate, near-term, and sustaining support. The UAC crafted a 10-point action plan to urge city leaders to implement a comprehensive approach that spans the full continuum of homelessness

COLFAX COLLABORATIVE

We continue to work with our fellow Colfax BIDs (West Colfax, Bluebird District, and Colfax Mayfair BID) as the Colfax Collaborative to tackle shared issues and ensure that the 2017 Elevate Denver Bond funds, which included funding for pedestrian improvements along Colfax, are equitably distributed along the corridor.

ECONOMIC RELIEF & RECOVERY COUNCIL

The Economic Relief & Recovery Council or ERRC was formed as a response to the pandemic.

Our Executive Director, Frank Locantore, serves as co-chair of the BID Subcommittee, which brings BID leaders together to get long- and short-term relief to businesses and share successful strategies that can be replicated across the numerous districts in Denver.



STAR PROGRAM

The Support Team Assisted Response (STAR) program sends health care professionals, rather than police officers, to engage individuals experiencing crises related to mental health issues, poverty, homelessness, and substance abuse. We support the citywide expansion of the STAR program and our Operations Manager, Mitch Freund, attends all meetings, monitors progress, and provides a helpful perspective.

CARING FOR DENVER

The Caring For Denver Foundation was created in 2018 to address Denver's mental health and substance misuse needs by growing community-informed solutions, dismantling stigma, and turning the community's desire to help into action. Our Executive Director, Frank Locantore, serves on the Caring For Denver Foundation's board of directors.

CIVIC CENTER NEXT 100

Located at the heart of the city and surrounded by many of our key civic and cultural institutions, Civic Center has served as Denver's most significant gathering spot for cultural events, festivals, and First Amendment rallies for over 100 years. Our Operations Manager, Mitch Freund, served on the Civic Center Next 100 Stakeholder Advisory Committee to help reimagine the park's future and ensure a dynamic outdoor space for residents and visitors of Colfax.

Civic Center Park & Bannock Street / Final Concept Plan / Winter2022








We want everyone to feel safe, welcome, and comfortable on Colfax. The criminal activity, alcohol/drug abuse, and mental illness that converge on Colfax require a compassionate and multifaceted approach. The Colfax Ave BID's Safety Program works to untangle these distinct challenges.

PEDESTRIAN LIGHTS

Last year, we installed eight new pedestrian light poles in the 1400 block of Pearl Street, one of the more challenging blocks in the district when it comes to crime.



NO TRESPASS AGREEMENTS

We offer free, legally-worded No Trespassing signs for business and property owners. These signs, in conjunction with a No Trespassing agreement with Denver Police District 6, allow police to enforce No Trespassing laws even if the business owner is not physically present. The BID handed out 98 signs to business and property owners in 2021.

SAFETY DESIGNS

In 2021, the BID awarded funds to district businesses via our Safety Design program. The goal is to reduce crime by designing a physical environment that positively influences human behavior. Businesses or property owners - like Denver Drug and Liquor, pictured here - received matching funds to improve the safety and security of their outside environment.





SAFER ALLEYS

In 2021, we worked with adjacent property owners at Lion's Lair to clean up their alley space. This included power washing, trash and graffiti removal, and plans to install lighting in the alley to deter criminal activity and provide outdoor space for Lion's Lair patrons.

In 2022, our safety committee will create positive activations on the street to displace negative activity we see in the district. Our collaboration will be with youth-focused organizations to highlight better paths young folks could take instead of getting into crime.

STREETSCAPE

The Colfax Ave Streetscape Plan provides a vision for the future of Colfax, including safety improvements, wayfinding, and building guidelines. We know that Colfax holds a special place in the hearts of many and we spent hundreds of hours working with our stakeholders, business and property owners, residents and friends to create a plan that provides enhanced safety guides, respects the historic nature of the street and improves the pedestrian experience, all while keeping our independent and original street thriving.

16TH AVENUE SHARED STREET

The 16th Avenue Shared Street was established during the pandemic and designed to deter non-local vehicle trips and reduce speeds to create a safer environment for all ages and abilities to use the street for recreation and Streets Partnership to host community events that demonstrated the need for safe and accessible travel along 16th our many local businesses along Colfax for those who bike, walk, or roll to their



PORCH FEST


On October 23rd, the 16th Ave Porch Music Fest celebrated the benefits of safe, accessible, shared spaces for people. Neighbors from Gaylord Street to Humboldt Street opened their porches to host musical acts and community members, and called on Denver to permanently maintain 16th Avenue as a people-first shared street.

BIKE FROM WORK DAY

On September 22nd, we hosted a Bike From Work Day party at the Economist Apartments with live music, free beer, and tasty food samples from our local businesses.

COMING IN 2022

In 2022, we'll continue our focus on 16th Avenue as a safe street for everyone and a connector to our local businesses on Colfax through safe and aesthetically pleasing street installations. These efforts will complement the protected bike lane the City has planned for 16th Avenue west of Park Avenue and on the City Park Esplanade.


COMING TO COLFAX



BUS RAPID TRANSIT (BRT) Colfax is a key east-west transportation route and ridership for the 15/15L bus is higher than all other RTD bus routes. Center-running bus rapid transit (BRT) is planned with a dedicated

bus routes. Center-running bus rapid transit (BRT) is planned with a dedicated transit lane in each direction. BRT will increase the number of people coming to Colfax by nearly 50%, provide more affordable and reliable access to over 250,000 jobs and community services, reduce transit travel time by up to 15 minutes, improve pedestrian safety, and create exciting streetscape, placemaking and economic development opportunities. **Learn more at colfaxbrt.org**





1566 N WASHINGTON ST.

As part of the 2017 General Obligation (GO) Bond, Denver is investing \$25 million into a new Denver Police District 6 facility. The city recommended a new location for the station, so the future of the current police station building site is unknown. This site is a great opportunity for a community-centered plan for development of this City-owned parcel.

4 1150 E COLFAX

Kairoi Residential plans to build a seven-story 334-unit apartment building at 1150 E Colfax (the former Ramada Inn), with 6,000 square feet of ground floor retail space. Construction is currently underway with an anticipated move-in date of summer 2024.



1 601 E COLFAX

Formerly the beloved Tom's Diner, construction is underway on a reimagined concept for the 1967 Googie-style building. Tom's Starlight will host a cocktail bar in the original structure. The parking lot out back will be transformed into outdoor space with a garden and outdoor bar. Construction is underway and doors will open summer of 2022.

1080 E COLFAX

Consolidated Investment Group (CIG) purchased the former Smiley's Laundromat building at 1080 E Colfax in 2017. The project, called *Route 40*, will be a seven-story building with 210 apartments and 5,000 square feet of retail space.



5 COLFAX & FRANKLIN

A mixed-use project from Pando Holdings is underway located at the intersection of Colfax Ave and Franklin St. The project consists of an adaptive reuse of the existing 1890's mansion and a new seven-story building with 67 residential units. Construction will begin in July 2022 with a completion date of spring 2024.


